in a city that has forgotten and erased much of its history there are still places where traces of the past can be found deep histories both natural and human have been woven together over hundreds of years in places across t maki makaurau auckland forming potent sites of national significance this stunning book unearths these histories in three iconic landscapes pukekawa auckland domain maungakiekie one tree hill and the tuataua stonefields at ihum tao approaching landscapes as an archive lucy mackintosh delves deeply into specific places allowing us to understand histories that have not been written into books or inscribed upon memorials but which still resonate through auckland and beyond shifting grounds provides a rare historical assessment of t maki makaurau auckland s past with findings and stories that deepen understanding of new zealand history

as a group of islands in the far south west pacific ocean new zealand has a history that is steeped in the sea its people have encountered the sea in many different ways along the coast in port on ships beneath the waves behind a camera and in the realm of the imagination while new zealanders have continually altered their marine environments the ocean too has influenced their lives a multi disciplinary work encompassing history marine science archaeology and visual culture new zealand and the sea explores new

zealand s varied relationship with the sea challenging the conventional view that history unfolds on land leading and emerging scholars highlight the dynamic ocean centred history of these islands and their inhabitants offering fascinating new perspectives on new zealand s pasts the ocean has profoundly shaped culture across this narrow archipelago the meeting of land and sea is central in historical accounts of polynesian discovery and colonisation european exploratory voyaging sealing whaling and the littoral communities that supported these plural occupations and the mass migrant passage from britain frances steel

by any measure new zealand must confront monumental issues in the years ahead from the future of work to climate change wealth inequality to new populism these challenges are complex and even unprecedented yet why does new zealand s political discussion seem so diminished and our political imagination unequal to the enormity of these issues and why is this gulf particularly apparent to young new zealanders these questions sit at the centre of max harris s new zealand project this book represents from the perspective of a brilliant young new zealander a vision for confronting the challenges ahead unashamedly idealistic the new zealand project arrives at a time of global upheaval that demands new conversations about our shared future

with photographs and quotes from her many hugely loved books patricia grace begins with her grandparents and parents and takes us through her childhood her education marriage and up to the present day in this touching and self deprecating story of her life the life of a writer of a maori woman and of a teacher it expresses the love for family and for ancestral land shows the prejudices she had to face and that made her stronger and tracks her career as a writer we live by the sea which hems and stitches the scalloped edges of the land renowned writer patricia grace begins her remarkable memoirs beside her beloved hongoeka bay it is the place she has returned to throughout her life and fought for one of many battles she has faced it was when i first went to school that i found out that i was a maori girl i found that being different meant that i could be blamed as she shows her experiences good and bad joyous and insightful have fuelled what became a focus of her life i had made up my mind that writing was something i would always do

what would a history of new zealand look like that rejected thomas carlyle s definition of history as the biography of great men and focused instead on the experiences of women one that shifted the angle of vision and examined the stages of this country s development from the points of view of wives daughters mothers grandmothers sisters and aunts that considered their lives as distinct from though often unwillingly influenced by those of history s great men in her ground breaking history of new zealand women barbara brookes provides just such a history this is more than an account of women in new zealand from those who arrived on the first waka to the grammy and man booker prize winning young women of the current decade it is a comprehensive history of new zealand seen through a female lens brookes argues that while european men erected the political scaffolding to create a small nation women created the infrastructure necessary for colonial society to succeed concepts of home marriage and family brought by

settler women and integral to the developing state transformed the lives of m ori women the small scale of new zealand society facilitated rapid change so that by the twenty first century women are no longer defined by family contexts in her long awaited book barbara brookes traces the factors that drove that change her lively narrative draws on a wide variety of sources to map the importance in women s lives not just of legal and economic changes but of smaller joys such as the arrival of a piano from england or the freedom of riding a bicycle

we are heading towards thomas piketty s predicted steady state of wealth being worth six times national income we are not immune to his prognosis of a return to victorian style levels of inequality the most recent nbr rich list has revealed the biggest proportional increase in wealth since the list first appeared in 1986 but what do these figures mean and what else do we know about new zealand s fortunes following his groundbreaking work on income inequality max rashbrooke examines how wealth shapes our experience drawing on previously unpublished data he explores what constitutes wealth in new zealand where how and why it is held in doing so he addresses how wealth has come to be so unevenly distributed and why this imbalance is something we can no

longer ignore

from the 1950s to the 1980s the new zealand government took more than 100 000 children from experiences of strife neglect poverty or family violence and placed them under state care in residential facilities in homes like epuni and kingslea kohitere and allendale the state took over as parent the state failed within institutions children faced abysmal conditions limited education and social isolation they endured physical sexual and psychological violence as well as secure cells knock out sedatives and electro convulsive therapy this book tells the story of 105 new zealanders who experienced this mass institutionalisation informed by thousands of pages of child welfare accounts letters health reports legal statements as well as interviews stanley tells the children s story growing up in homes characterised by violence and neglect removal into the state s care network daily life in the institutions violence and punishment and the legacy of this treatment for victims today the state masqueraded as a good parent but its violence and negligence made things worse for children this book is a moving account of the experiences of those placed into state care and a powerful call for redress and change it was over and over it wasn t just one night it was many drunken nights you know the smell of alcohol and stuff like that i was often beaten i got so used to the beatings that i never used to cry any more i hid under the cot and every time i knew they were coming i d have to come out and just be prepared for anything ed he said to me you re going somewhere he said it with glee you re going somewhere where they know how to treat people like you it was like he knew what the place hokio was like and what was in store for me and it gave him a great deal of pleasure i find that really cruel ray i remember looking out the window and said there s police out there what s going on yeah and they d come to pick me up to put me in the girls home i was just in shock they wanted to take me what have i done the police just took me down to the station and then the social worker took me from there to bollard and then i was chucked in the cells nanette

the new zealand wars is a powerful revisionist history revealing the enormous tactical and military skill of maori and the inability of the victorian interpretation of racial conflict to acknowledge those qualities this account of the new zealand wars changed how the country's history was understood belich undertakes a complete reinterpretation of the crucial episode in new zealand history and the result is a very different picture from the one previously given in historical works maori in this new view won the northern war and stalemated the british in the taranaki war of 1860 61 only to be defeated by 18 000 british troops in the waikato war of 1863 64 the secret of effective maori resistance was an innovative military system the modern pa a trench and bunker fortification of a sophistication not achieved in europe until 1915 according to the author the degree of maori success in all four major wars is still underestimated even to the point where in the case of one war the wrong side is said to have won here belich sets out to show how historical distortions have arisen over time and revises our understanding of new zealand history by using fresh evidence and a systematic re analysis of old evidence

the divide between new zealand s poorest and wealthiest inhabitants has widened alarmingly over recent decades differences in income have grown faster than in most other developed countries new zealand society is being reshaped stretching to accommodate new distance between those who have and those who have not income inequality is a crisis that affects us all a diverse gathering of new zealand scholars journalists researchers business leaders workers students and parents share these pages their voices speak to the complex shape of income inequality and its effects on the communities of these pacific islands

the task of living in modern new zealand and especially in modern auckland is not just to understand how to live with different peoples but how to adapt to the future that has already happened new zealand is a nation that exists on pacific islands but does not will not perhaps cannot see itself as a pacific island nation yet turning to the pacific argues damon salesa enables us to grasp a fuller understanding of what life is really like on these shores after all salesa argues in many ways new zealand s pacific future has already happened setting a course through the islands of pacific life in new zealand tara tokoroa porirua amaru and beyond he charts a country becoming even more pacific by the hour what would it mean this far sighted book asks for new zealand to recognise its pacific talent and finally act like a pacific nation

since colonisation new zealand has been mythologised as a land of milk and honey a promised land of natural abundance and endless opportunity in the twenty first century the country has become literally a land of milk and honey as agricultural exports from such commodities dominate the national economy but does new zealand live up to its promise in this introductory textbook for first year sociology students some of this country s leading social scientists help us to make sense of contemporary new zealand in 21 chapters the authors examine new zealand s political identity and constitution our maori pakeha pacific and asian peoples problems of class poverty and inequality gender and sexualities and contemporary debates around ageing incarceration and the environment the authors find a complex society where thirty years of neoliberal economics and globalising politics have exacerbated inequalities that are differentially experienced by class ethnicity gender sexuality and age these social divides and problems are at the heart of this text for sociology students and for a wider audience of new zealanders a land of milk and honey is a lively introduction to where we have come from where we are now and where new zealand society might be headed

it should be remembered as new zealand s answer to britain s great train robbery in the dead of the night robbers broke into the

waterfront industry commission s offices and made off with an audacious loot equivalent to almost 1 million today this 1956 heist which eventually came to be known as the waterfront payroll robbery was executed with military precision and the robbers left nothing but a smoking office and an empty safe behind them the crime was eventually pinned on small time crook trevor nash when four years later nash made a brazen prison escape attempt he rose to notoriety as a kind of anti establishment hero but to this day uncertainty remains about whether nash alone was responsible for the waterfront heist could he really cunning as he was have pulled it off all by himself and what happened to the money

a brief history of auckland s urban form outlines the development of auckland s urban form from early colonial settlement to the modern auckland metropolis it is challenging to encapsulate the growth of a city this size in 26 pages and so the report aims to capture the key relevant drivers behind the growth in suburbs including infrastructure provision state housing and in later decades major planning decisions a main feature of this report is the series of growth maps the report is chronological in nature and each section with the exception of two time periods 1880 1899 and 1990 1999 includes a map that shows growth over time in the built up areas as well as the development of the rail and motorway systems these maps replicate and continue a series of maps first included in a 1967 article by g t bloomfield on the growth of auckland 1840 1966 arc website
