australia based on the six part abc series created by lin jie kong and jennifer wong the book lovingly captures the stories of ten very different families who run chinese restaurants from queensland s hervey bay to western australia s dunsborough and features 32 classic australian chinese recipes as well as revealing the secrets behind everything from sizzling mongolian lamb to deep fried ice cream chopsticks or fork includes trivia on the lazy susan encounters with the country s biggest chinese restaurant fans a game of chinese restaurant bingo just waiting to be played on your next night out and more chinese restaurant takeaways than you can poke a chop stick at this is a unique celebration of an integral part of australian cultural and culinary history
